## New Jennie Jaynes Complex opens at Smith-Cotton High School

Tiger Stadium and the new Jennie Jaynes Complex opened with a ribbon cutting ceremony on Monday, March 16, 2015.

Members of the Sedalia school board and Sedalia School District administration spoke briefly before cutting the ribbon at the gates of the complex. Sedalia School

District #200 Superintendent Brad Pollitt echoed the sentiments of the crowd when he said, "It's an exciting time to live in Sedalia,

and it is a day when all of us can be proud to be a Tiger." The \$6.3 million project was made possible by \$2 million in gifts from private individuals and local businesses. The project was also funded from the district's capital improvement funds so no new tax levy was needed. The Jennie Jaynes complex can be used by the high school's PE classes and football, track, soccer, baseball, softball, band, and JROTC programs. The sports complex includes a synthetic turf football field, all-weather track, concessions buildings on home and away sides, field house and practice

fields. The home stands will seat approximately 3,000, and the visitor's stands approximately 500. High School principal Wade Norton and his team are making plans to hold the 2015 Smith-Cotton commencement ceremony, weather permitting, in Tiger Stadium on May 16.
